Plato:

- 1. Time = "Moving image of eternity"
- 2. Celestial bodies = "Created to preserve the measures of Time".

What does this tell us about time?

Aristotle:

- 1. <u>The paradoxes</u>: "Time does not exist at all, or barely, and in the obscure way".
- 2. <u>Time</u> = "the number of motion with respect to before and after".
- **3.** <u>Time</u> = "movement. Only is movement in so far as it admits enumeration."
- 4. <u>Time</u> = "continuous, as the points in a line. But all points are the same and all "nows" are different".
- 5. <u>Time</u> "is by its nature the cause rather of decay, since it is the number of change, and change removes what is".
- 6. St. Augustine's view of Time
