

README for responsive course web page template (CSS-grid).

Main Features

- Responsive design to make pages readable on all appropriate devices including phones, tablets, and computers.
- Layout is very basic: header and footer, navigation sidebar on left, and page content in the middle.

Instructions for use and modification

- **First and foremost**, play with the web pages to see what they do. Try them on your computer, tablet and phone.

Instructions for how to modify these template pages for your own course follow.

- You must edit the `settings.php` file which sets

```
$course_name = "Math 0/0";  
$course_title = "Division by Zero and other Dangerous Deeds";  
$web_page_maintainer = "Name of web page maintainer";  
$web_page_maintainer_email = "web-page-maintainer@dartmouth.edu";
```

- The layout of the header and sidebar (navigation) is in `title-navigation-menu.php`. The current navigation links are:

```
<div class="framebox sidebar">  
  <ul>  
    <li><a href="index.php">Home</a></li>  
    <li><a href="general.php">General Information</a></li>  
    <li><a href="announcements.php">Announcements</a></li>  
    <li><a href="syllabus.php">Syllabus<a></li>  
    <li><a href="assignments.php">Assignments</a></li>  
    <li><a href="resources.php">Resources</a></li>  
    <!--li><a href="empty-content.php">Empty Content</a></li-->  
  </ul>  
</div>
```

- So for example, `General Information` is what will be visible in the sidebar navigation, while `general.php` is the web page to which the link points.
- Remove unwanted items by deleting them or commenting them out (as with the line with “Empty Content”).
- Add items by cloning existing lines; the `empty-content.php` file is a template.

- The content of rest of the pages is contained in `general.php`, `announcements.php`, `syllabus.php`, `assignments.php`, and `resources.php`, and are fairly straightforward to edit.
- **Important notes:**
 - The “file” `general.php` is a link to a multi-section version of the information file. Also included is one for a single-section course, `general-singlesection.php`.
 - I have linked homework and exam solutions as well as lectures to a folder called `restricted-access`. It is restricted in the sense that only Dartmouth IP addresses can see the contents. Feel free to put other things in there as well if you want to shield them from the web at large.
